KEEPING CHRIST IN CHRISTMAS!

Dear First Church Family and Friends,

Thanksgiving kicks off one of my favorite times of the year. For the church, it is a time of joyful preparation for the day we celebrate the birth of our Savior. Each year, I look forward to each of the Advent Sunday and Christmas Eve services as we point towards the Birth of Jesus. How about you?

There are a couple of things, however, that really irritate me during this season. One is 'Black Friday.' I wonder, "Who came up with that name?" Have you ever thought about it? For retailers, it is the kickoff of one of the greatest seasons of consumer spending. I'm thinking that retailers, credit card companies, and many others ought to call Black Friday 'Good Friday' but, of course, that name is already taken!

Another irritant is the use of 'Xmas' when referring to 'Christmas,' to either just abbreviate the word or to specifically remove the name of Christ. Even though for many folks Christmas is a day without Christ, it is a reminder for Christian believers that God sent to us and the world the greatest gift possible. **How do we keep Christ in Christmas?**

One tradition Pam and I have kept during all of years of marriage is to place a crèche under our Christmas tree. The gifts are only placed under the tree after Christmas Eve services. Prior to opening our gifts on Christmas Day, we read the Christmas Story from Luke 2:1-20. If you do not have a tradition in your home for intentionally remembering why we have Christmas to celebrate, maybe this is the year to prayerfully consider how you might start such a tradition.

This year we have the privilege of celebrating Christmas Day on Sunday. Knowing that many will be traveling, and that families with children will open gifts early in the morning, **we will have one worship service of Christmas celebration at 11:00 am.** While on the subject of worship, **we will experience a treat on New Year's Day with the cantata 'Winter Rose' and the sharing of Holy Communion during a single morning worship service, also at 11:00 am.**

May this be a great Christmas season for you and yours as together we 'Keep Christ in Christmas!'

Thoughts from Your Lay Leader

This month I want to share some thoughts about silence. Many of us spend our lives without the hint of silence. Just think how all the noise around us keeps us from hearing our innermost thoughts. Wouldn't it be nice to practice silence?

Richard Foster, in the book entitled *A Year With God* shares, "Though silence sometimes involves the absence of speech, it always involves the act of listening. Simply to refrain from talking, without a heart listening to God, is not silence." Our aim should be to cultivate an inner silence, so that we can turn our hearts to God even while we 'hear' noise and converse with others.

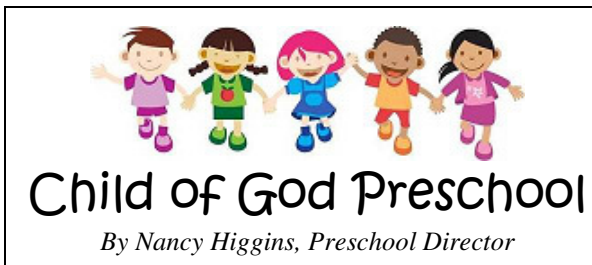
Silence can also offer us the chance to control our tongues, so we can listen to others as well as to God. This can be important for our relationships.

Here's a plan to help develop a discipline of silence in our lives. Each of the next 10 days, spend at least 15 minutes in silence. Find the quietest place you can, and make sure you honor the silence by being silent. Begin the time with a short prayer asking the Lord to help you block out any extra noise, so you can focus on God. Spend the time mostly seeking to quietly listen for what God may tell you. If need be also read scripture if that helps you find the silence you need. If you can journal about this time with God afterwards and reflect on the outcome it will help you grow in this process. The silence will reward you richly.

What a way to provide yourself with a time of refreshing for your relationship with the Lord!

FOOD PANTRY & 'MDF'

From week to week, the worship bulletin insert include a list of the Food Pantry items needed, and First Church members and friends are encouraged to bring at least one item for the Food Pantry when they come for worship each week. In addition, folks are encouraged to make a financial donation to the Ministers' Discretionary Fund (a.k.a. 'MDF') which is a fund that is used at the discretion of the ministerial staff to help persons with certain living expenses (rent, utilities, etc.).

Due to the generosity of the First Church Family, **we have given out about 700 bags of groceries, and have been able to help 232 families with the 'last amount due' on their utilities or rent.** Times are tough for many is the current economy, but we have been able to help many by your giving.

Thanks to all of you for your continued generosity, and to the volunteers that help keep the Food Pantry organized and the shelves stocked..

Annual Mitten Tree Project

Kroger Community Rewards

The Kroger Community Rewards Program still exists, and is a way to donate a portion of your purchases to the church, much the same way the gift cards do through the SCRIP program. Over the last several months several members have asked how they can enroll in the Kroger program.

Kroger requires each person to stop at the service desk at the local stores and request the church receive the proceeds from the program. You can enroll by stopping at the service desk and updating your Kroger PlusCard Database by giving them the church number. To register online, go to: krogercommunityrewards.com (if you currently have a Kroger PlusCard). You will be asked to sign in as a new customer online if you have not designated the church as your organization to receive the rewards.

MINISTRY MATTERS

The Kroger Community Rewards Program is an easy way for members and friends of First Church to support the church. Through the program, each time your Kroger PlusCard is scanned, a certain percentage of the sale will go to the church. Kroger monitors the program and sends a check to the church each month with a listing of the total purchases and the percentage the church receives.
